Title: Director of Clinical Operations

Position Description: The position of Director of Clinical Operations for the Center for Organ Recovery & Education (CORE) is one of considerable responsibility. He/She is responsible for orientation, ongoing training, clinical development and the evaluation process of the procurement staff (Organ Procurement Coordinators, Family Support & Education Coordinator (shared responsibility) and Recovery Coordinators. He/She will handle any/all aspects of donation and/or the donation process. He/She will also be responsible to perform donor evaluation, function as a designated requestor and obtain consent and facilitate donor management within assigned hospitals in CORE's service area and throughout the United States and Canada. He/She will also be responsible for the coordination of the operating room staff as well as the perfusion and preservation of post mortem organs. The Director of Clinical Operations reports to, and works under the supervision of the Vice President, Clinical Operations. He/She is responsible for the promotion of a positive work place that promotes and assures the overall success of the organization. He/She is responsible for participating in a work environment which is safe proof, injury-free, fire safe, free of violence and free from every form of discrimination. He/She must obtain CPTC Certification within one year and complete Quality ASQ training.

Qualifications: The incumbent for the position of Director of Clinical Operations for the Center for Organ Recovery & Education (CORE) should be a health care professional with a Baccalaureate degree in one of the health sciences. Critical Care experience is highly desirable. He/She should possess strong leadership skills, strong knowledge of clinical work activities and professional commitment. Five to ten years of management experience is highly desirable. He/She must have strong communication and interpersonal skills, along with sound judgment. He/She must possess the ability to work long, unpredictable hours. He/She must be available twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week while on the call schedule. He/She must demonstrate a commitment to CORE and to the donation process.
